- 5. Health quality Improving services at Dr Grays, ridiculous that sick people have to travel to Aberdeen. Listen to what local people think and act accordingly, stop wasting money on ridiculous projects that will fail. Get a joined up system for buses and trains
- 6. Health quality -improved drug and alcohol services this is a major problem in Moray -
