CURRICULUM FOR EXCELLENCE (CfE) - CHILDMINDERS

This course is aimed at childminders

What is Curriculum for Excellence?

Curriculum for Excellence (CfE) provides a flexible and enriched educational curriculum for all children and young people from 3-18. The curriculum includes all of the experiences which are planned for children and young people through their education, wherever they are being educated. The Curriculum links closely with the Pre Birth to Three Framework, Building the Ambition guidance and should be referred to and considered when planning for children's overall, continuous development.

The curriculum for all learners is underpinned by Scottish Government policy for development and learning. Learning begins at birth and the 3-18 curriculum aims to ensure that all children and young people in Scotland develop the attributes, knowledge and skills they will need to flourish in life, learning and work. This will allow them to demonstrate four key capacities – to be successful learners, confident individuals, responsible citizens and effective contributors.

What does it mean for me as a childminder?

Childminders deliver early learning and childcare (ELC) as part of their key role in looking after children. The Scottish Government's funding for ELC is currently 600 hours per annum. This will increase to 1140 hours by 2020. Childminders are often best placed to look after these young children and should be contracted by their local authority to deliver these funded hours alongside nurseries and playgroups. Childminders need to be aware of the CfE and be able to link this to their childminding practice.

Why should I attend this workshop?

This workshop has been designed specifically for childminders with the aim to introduce and provide guidance to enable childminders to gain an understanding of how to work with the Curriculum for Excellence into their daily practice.
